Program Summary

This course provides an overview of the Healthcare Professional Responsibility and Reporting Act and the mechanics of the reporting required. Participants will learn the history of the “Cullen Bill” and its practical effect on the healthcare profession and the professional boards. The course is intended for DAsG who practice before the healthcare boards, or serve as their counsel. The course will include an opportunity for brainstorming about ways in which the information gathered under this Act can be brought to bear in the normal oversight functions exercised by the Boards.

Who is the faculty?

Deputy Attorney General Jeri Warhaftig has been a licensed attorney in the State of NJ since 1981. For the past 21 years she has been an administrative prosecutor assigned to matters before all of the Health Care Licensing Boards and primarily the Board of Medical Examiners. She was also counsel to the Physician Assistant Advisory Committee at its inception and worked with them in the preparation of their initial regulations. As a prosecutor she has handled matters in every level of the State court system. DAG Warhaftig serves as Chief of the Professional Boards Prosecutions Section. In addition to supervising the ongoing prosecutions of State licensees, DAG Warhaftig is counsel to the Impairment Review Committee of the Board of Medical Examiners and a frequent instructor in the Attorney General’s Advocacy Institute.
