Program Summary

DAG Bruce Solomon, the long-time OPRA Custodian for the Office of the Attorney General, will channel Sherlock Holmes, “the world’s only consulting detective,” to arrive at numerous deductions in an attempt to solve some of the mysteries of the Open Public Records Act. For the 2017 season, “Sherlock: A Study in OPRA” offers three spine-tingling, mysterious OPRA adventures: “The Hounds of Public Recordsville,” “The Sign of 39” and “A Scandal in Bergen” – all based on recent decisions of the New Jersey Superior Court (2016 and 2017 vintage) and stories by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle.

Who Should Attend?

This presentation will be of special interest to agency records custodians, but is open to all government attorneys, space allowing.

Who Is the Faculty?

Bruce Solomon is a Deputy Attorney General in the Legal Affairs and Employee Relations section of the Office of the Attorney General. Since 2001, Bruce has served as the Custodian of Records for the Office of the Attorney General and the Department of Law and Public Safety, where he supervises divisional records custodians for the fourteen divisions and agencies which comprise L&PS, with oversight for all Department records requests and legal challenges under OPRA. Bruce has a lead role in the development and implementation of L&PS public records access rules, policies, procedures and practices. A graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Madison and Rutgers University School of Law, Bruce served as the General Counsel for the New Jersey Institute of Technology and was a partner in private practice before joining the Division of Law in 1993.

State Employees

To do so, your computer **must** be attached to the government's Garden State Network. Upon opening the AGAI Course Registration System home page, you will see the Create Account link in the Login Box. Click on it and create your account, which will include you selecting a user name and password. Once you create your account, you can access the AGAI Course Registration System at <http://reg2.dcj.lps.state.nj.us/lpcreg/login.aspx?portalid=2> to register for future courses or to manage your account. Please retain your user name and password for your records.

Non-State Employees or State Employees not Connected to the Garden State Network

If you are not a State employee, or are otherwise unable to access the AGAI Course Registration System through the Garden State Network, kindly email the Advocacy Institute at: njagai@njoag.gov for an authorization code to allow you access to the AGAI Course Registration System through the My New Jersey portal. **Setting up your account through the portal is a two-step process, the details of which are set forth in the next two paragraphs.**

Once you receive the portal authorization code you will be prompted to go to the My New Jersey portal at <http://www.state.nj.us/> and create a portal account. Once your portal account is created you are prompted to enter your authorization code. This is Step 1 of the process, which you need only do once.

If you have already been issued an authorization code in the past you do not need to request another one. You can log into your account on the Garden State Network at <http://www.state.nj.us> and under the heading NJ L&PS Applications you will see the Attorney General's Advocacy Institute's Registration System. Click on that and log into your account on our system.

Upon setting up your portal account, you need to set up your AGAI Course Registration System account. This is Step 2. To do so, log on to the My New Jersey Portal <http://www.state.nj.us/>. Upon opening the AGAI Course Registration System home page, you will see the Create Account link in the Login Box.
